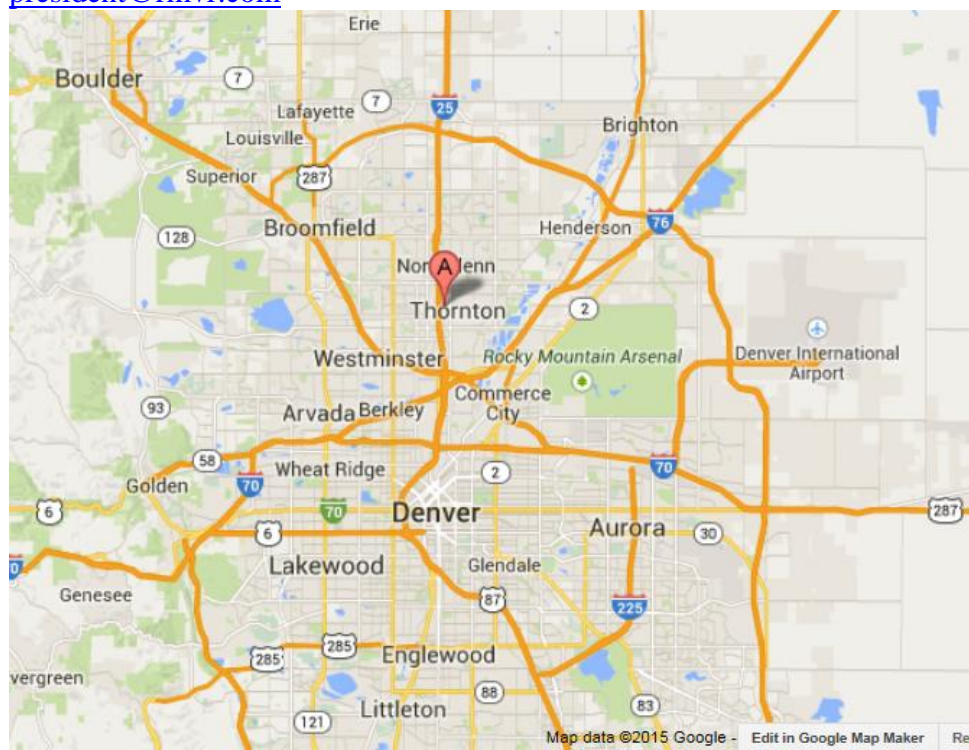
After years of Board Meetings at Garcia's, starting in February 2015 meetings will be moved North.

Glen Conser – Track Manager
Cameras are being installed at HPR. Point, tilt, zoom and fixed cameras. Turn 3 Point tilt zoom to watch turns 1, 2 and 3. Wall at 7, 8 and 9 Two point tilt zoom cameras focused on Turn 11 Fixed camera. Last camera will be at the gate to watch cars coming in and out. Cameras will enable control to respond faster to incidents on the track.

All cameras will have "park positions" when no input is received. Park position will be wide angle covering a general area.

Two monitors. One multi-camera, one single camera that will be switched as needed to highlight a single area. Cameras will run on battery packs and solar power.

Corner Lights Double tall 28 inches high. Double tall double wide. Turn 1, 4 and 8 and 13 will have Double wide/Double tall. All other turns will have double tall Third touch screen monitor will be at control desk. Corners will have iPads to control that corner. Standing Yellow, Blue, Flashing Yellow, Debris. Red and Black will be at Control. System is going to be installed by April 1st.

Bob Alder
RMVR makes the transition away from the home grown system to Motorsports Reg. Company is doing 600 organizations throughout the country. Online. User Name and Password. License Number and Car Number. You'll have your own garage with your cars then you decide which car then pay the fees. Similar to what we have now but now being run by third party rather than Bob and Dee. Formula Vee School Scholarship 11th Year

The Formula Vee Group is continuing its Drivers' School Scholarship in 2015. Now known as the Formula Vee Drivers' School Scholarship, it still offers free use of one or more Formula Vee race cars for RMVR's Drivers' School at Pikes Peak Intl Raceway April 18 & 19, 2015.

The Scholarship began in 2005 when Belinda Temple donated the RCA Formula Vee #18 to be rebuilt, driven, and maintained in honor of her late husband, Bill Temple. Ten Scholarship recipients have completed RMVR's Drivers' School and six have purchased their own Vees for racing with RMVR. In October 2012, the RCA #18 was sold to another RMVR member and the Vee Group wanted to continue the Scholarship with one or more different Vees to be offered for use by student drivers.

As before, the Scholarship winner(s) will be selected from applications received by March 15 by the Vee Scholarship Committee. The Committee members are Bill Fleming, Jess Valentine, and Chad Wight. Considerations for selection include history of RMVR membership and volunteer work and likelihood of purchasing and/or entering a vintage car in RMVR events. The scholarship recipient is responsible for the Drivers' School application and fee (if any), medical eligibility, and personal safety gear. Scholarship car owners will provide car transport and support for the Drivers' School weekend. Prior Scholarship recipients are not eligible. The 2015 race season is fast approaching and it's time to think about getting your cars ready for the season. Part of getting ready for the season is getting an Annual Tech Inspection for your race car. [Here's detailed information on the inspection process, both preseason annual tech and inspection at events.](#)

As you no doubt know, there are some big incentives to get your Annual Tech done before the season begins:

- < First, the Annual Tech is a way to have **another pair of eyes spend some quality time with your car.** Annual Tech Inspections look at more items than an event tech and they aren't as hurried. This results in better safety for you.
- < Second, the Annual Tech allows you to **avoid three weeks of busy work** by **submitting and showing your log book** (noting the Annual Tech) at the next three 2013 races and you can get an event tech sticker without the hassle of an actual event tech. How great is that?

So, get 'er done. Here's a link to the [tech inspection form which you should fill out](#) and do your self-inspection before presenting the car for inspection.

For your convenience our tech crews will be available to perform Preseason Annual Tech Inspections this spring at various locations along the Front Range. At these upcoming group tech days, our guys will do the Annual Inspection for free.

As I sit here typing this President's Message for the March Messenger, it is 19 degrees outside with six inches of snow on the ground and it is snowing AGAIN. A very big change from 68 degrees at this time last month. Even though it is cold outside, it is still time to get that car ready for the Spring Race at HPR on May 16th and 17th. Get those parts ordered, order those tires and get started on that "to do" list for your race car you made up last fall. You did make a list last fall didn't you?

The RMVR Board held its first meeting on February 18th at the Thornton City Hall. There were approximately 23 people at the meeting, including eleven Board members. Two major items were discussed at the meeting. The first was presented by Glen Conser, the HPR track manager, who talked about the new corner station warning lights/observation camera system that will be installed and operational by April 1st of this year. Glen laid out the plans for the new light system, how it would be installed and how the new system would operate. There will LED warning lights at every corner station that can be operated from the control trailer. These lights will be used in addition to the existing corner workers and traditional flagging operations. There is also a new video observation camera system that will be installed to monitor all 15 corners of the full race course, the straights, the pits and the guard shack. There are some cameras that can rotate 360 degrees and some fixed position cameras, all with zoom capabilities. Race control should be able to monitor every corner during a race for safety purposes. The new system installation is estimated to cost in the neighborhood of \$80,000. These funds will come from the operational budget for HPR. Installation will start in March and be completed by April 1st. The system should be operational for the RMVR May Race on the 16th and 17th. Watch for the new light system on your first lap around the track in May. The use of the new warning light system will be explained to the drivers at the first Saturday morning Driver's Meeting in May. The second topic was presented by Bob Alder. His topic was related to the installation and operation of the new on-line race registration software from MotorsportsReg. This new software will replace our antiquated and "home grown" current on-line registration software that has been maintained by both Bob Alder and Katja Stokly for the last seven years or so. It is labor intensive and not a user friendly system to operate. Bob is the main man who runs the program, and he is now trying to back away from the duties as software "magician" for RMVR. He says it is time to move on and purchase some software that is accepted, used and operated by over 600 national racing organizations. Bob and Katja are currently working on "migrating" our current membership and Club information into the new software.

It is hoped that this work will be completed so that the software will be operational by the first Spring Race at HPR in May. The Board voted unanimously to approve the move to this new on-line registration software from MotorsportsReg. It should simplify the on-line registration process and be much more user friendly once each driver creates his or her account and enters the required information during their first race registration process. All clubs that have switched to this software have raved about how great the system is to use, how user friendly it is and how great the software support is from MotorsportsReg. It should bring the RMVR on-line registration process into the 21st Century and in line with most of the other racing organizations across the country.
